# List for PostFinance international payments (IP List)

### 1. Introduction

This document describes the data structure of the PostFinance IP List. The list is updated daily and made available on the Internet by PostFinance free of charge; it can be downloaded as an ASCII file from **www.postfinance.ch/manuals.** 

The IP List contains all the available options for international payments (all currencies) and domestic payments in foreign currencies. This information is designed as an aid in the execution of payments. The intention is that both software producers and payment software users (clients) should scan the ASCII file into their accounts payable and payment programs to enable plausibility testing of electronic payment orders (EPO).

PostFinance Ltd advises software producers to refer customers wishing to execute international or domestic payments in foreign currencies to the download page of the IP List. Scanning of the IP List should, if possible, be facilitated by means of an import function.

(In case of an automatic download: The access is only possible, if any arbitrary UserAgent is being used in the http header.)

ASCII ISO 8859-1, fixed data-set lengths. The tab sign is the separator.
